



## EDUCATIONAL SPECIFICATION

- TEA requires districts to create a written educational plan that guides the design process of new facilities and major renovations to existing facilities.
- Educational Specifications are necessary as they provide the link between learning and the design of educational facilities.
- Ensures parity across district educational facilities & establishes expectations for future designs/renovations.
- Guarantees the alignment of physical environments with educational models.
- Must be approved before design development for a capital improvement project commences



### BASIC PLAN REQUIREMENTS

- District mission, vision, goals, and pedagogy expectations
- Details related to facility type, grade levels served, and maximum student enrollment
- Pertinent provisions of the multi -hazard emergency operations plan that informs functionality of facilities
- Guidance on inclusive design and how it is addressed through facility design
- Minimum total square footage required to comply with TEA expectations



#### ED. SPECSALIVING DOCUMENT

- Is a living document and requires periodic updates
- PBK facilitated a significant update in June 2021 involved input from teachers, other campus staff, and District program staff
- Commissioner's Rules Concerning Facilities were updated since then
- PBK once again facilitated the update process to ensure compliance with new expectations




